

GENERAL LITIGATION

The General Litigation Division of the NYC Law Department seeks an experienced attorney to represent the City in federal and State court litigation challenging important programs in diverse areas including education, health care, public assistance benefits, prison conditions, foster care, campaign finance and election law. Many of the division's cases are brought as class actions in federal court and raise complex and novel issues of statutory and constitutional construction. Recent cases have involved: a challenge to the accessibility of the City's homeless shelter system and programs for disabled persons under the ADA; a challenge under the State and federal constitutions and statutes to the manner in which the Department of Education deals with bullying, harassment and violence; and a challenge to the extent to which the Police Department accommodates the needs of limited English-proficient speakers in their interactions with police officers. Division lawyers are responsible for their own caseloads and handle court conferences, oral arguments, discovery including depositions, the preparation of legal papers, and hearings and trials in their cases.

Applicants must have significant relevant work experience following graduation from an ABA accredited law school and must be admitted and in good standing in New York State. Ideal applicants should demonstrate substantial litigation experience, exceptional organizational abilities, strong legal writing and analytical skills, strong interpersonal skills and excellent judgment.
