The New York State Office of the Attorney General is seeking an attorney to serve as the Section Chief of the IFR Unit of the Civil Recoveries Bureau, located at 55 Hanson Street, Brooklyn New York. The Unit recovers money owed to the State for the cost of care provided by Downstate Hospital. The Unit consists of one attorney, the Section Chief, who is responsible for managing the office and supervising five collections specialists and support staff. The Section Chief is responsible for a large number of hospital accounts and has frequent interactions with the hospital finance and executive staff. Legal work includes cost-recovery litigation in New York State Supreme and Surrogate's Courts, Article 81 proceedings, a broad range of motion practice, and judgment enforcement.

Suitable candidates must possess the following minimum qualifications:

- At **least five (5) years** of general civil litigation and Surrogate's Court experience;
- Excellent legal analysis, legal writing and editing, and oral advocacy skills;
- Strong organizational, interpersonal communication, problem solving, and teamwork skills;
- Bankruptcy experience and knowledge of Medicaid and Medicare is a plus;
- Comfort with and proficiency using technology to complete legal work, including knowledge of and experience with various computer software programs and case management platforms; and
