¹ CLE Credits are pending approval. This program is appropriate for both newly admitted and experienced attorneys. Certificates of attendance will be provided to those who register and attend.

² Pursuant to 22 NYCRR Part 146.4(b), "Mediators who wish to qualify for appointment to a court roster must have successfully completed at least 40 hours of approved training [including] at least 24 hours of training in basic mediation skills and techniques; and at least 16 hours of additional training on the specific mediation techniques pertaining to the subject area of the types of cases referred to them."

Participation in a course does not guarantee placement on a local court roster. Some Courts may require additional training and experience beyond the enumerated Part 146 requirements. Acceptance on court rosters may depend on a court's need for mediators at any given time and may include a particular court's need for mediators with specific case-type training or experience. Final placement on any court roster is at the discretion of the local Administrative Judge.
