The Office of the New York State Attorney General (OAG) is seeking an attorney with experience in information technology and consumer protection law for its [Bureau of Internet and Technology](#) (BIT) in New York City. BIT is responsible for the enforcement of New York’s privacy, data security, and consumer protection laws in the online and tech environment, as well as for enforcement of New York’s data breach notification laws. In recent years, the Bureau has investigated a wide range of issues affecting technology, including spyware, spam, online privacy, child safety, gambling, and internet fraud. Recent investigations have included broadband internet speeds, data breaches, false online endorsements, and speculative tickets. Some work will be dedicated to civil laws that protect New Yorkers from online bias-based violence and intimidation related to race, color, national origin, ancestry, gender, religion, religious practice, age, disability, and sexual orientation.

The selected candidate will be responsible for case investigation and development, settlement negotiation, and litigating affirmative cases on behalf of the OAG, as well as consumer outreach and drafting legislation. Applicants must have a minimum of **five (5) years of litigation experience**, strong writing skills, an interest in technology and related legal issues, and a commitment to public service. An understanding of and/or experience in technology and related legal issues, privacy, and data security is preferred.

Applicants must reside in (or intend to soon become a resident of) New York State and be admitted to practice law in New York State. In addition, the Public Officers Law requires that OAG attorneys be citizens of the United States. A two (2) year commitment upon being hired is a condition of employment.
